given to Arora for his immaculate developmental works such as

providing 4 MLED water to the denizens or construction of 5 kilometer long 'Adarsh Road', in Indira Gandhi Nagar.

Interestingly, Arora's achievements although spread over past nine months, have not been marred in the slightest by the Corona pandemic going on for the past five months. In that time, the board sold off 6,000 properties amassing a revenue of Rs 1400 crore.

The board also created an international record by selling 1010 houses in merely 35 days and generating a revenue of 162 crore rupees, a feat that has been recorded in World Book of Records, London. It was after this that the extremely successful Wednesday auction festival was initiated wherein e-bidding was undertaken, the Golden Jubilee Gift Scheme was initi-

ated among many other new initiatives.

RHB has also played important role in development of urban areas by giving projects such as Coaching Hub, City Park, Chowpati at Jaipur, Jodhpur and Kota and weekend homes among many others. Only recently the Board launched 14 independent housing projects under the Mukhyamantra Awas scheme.
